Good morning

Please see attached.

Adelaide Oval SMA Limited have applied to the Liquor and Gambling Commissioner to vary their existing liquor licence.

Existing Condition

Liquor shall only be sold or supplied in plastic cups, except in corporate facilities, dining rooms, or at functions and receptions.

Proposed Condition

Liquor shall only be sold or supplied in plastic cups <u>or aluminium cans</u>, except in corporate facilities, dining rooms, or at functions and receptions.

As you can see, the practical effect of the variation is obvious. If approved, liquor will permitted be sold and supplied in *cans* to patrons in *ALL areas of the ground*.

Clearly, from an operational policing perspective such a variation has the potential to endanger the health, safety and welfare of both the general public, and police, in the event of a disturbance occurring at the ground whereby cans are used as projectiles.

It is LEB's intention to oppose the application for variation.

PASA's View

It would be appreciated if you [PASA] could assist LEB, with your views on the proposed application by Adelaide Oval SMA Limited to vary their licence conditions?

Victorian Police Experience

I note that the MCG is currently, [or has recently completed] conducting a trial whereby liquor is permitted to be sold and supplied in cans in certain areas of the ground.

I also note, that there have been several disturbances that have occurred in recent times requiring a police response. I am interested to learn if the Victorian Police Union are in a position to comment on whether cans were used as projectiles by patrons involved in these disturbances at the MCG?

In addition, I am also interested to learn of the Victorian Police Union's position on the issue of liquor being sold in can at the MCG?

Would it be possible for you to contact your counterpart and seek their views on the above queries?

In order for LEB to finalise their submission a response would be required by Friday, 17 June.
