



Re: Freedom of Information Act application

In reference to your application made pursuant to the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (FOI Act), access was sought to:

"A copy of all data (including spreadsheets and reports) indicating the total number and the type of incidents reported to SAPOL related to units/dwellings located at Marsh Court, Novar Gardens, between 1 January 2022 and the present date."

South Australia Police (SAPOL) has located a document that falls within the scope of your request. The document is numbered and described in the following schedule. The schedule contains the details of the determination in compliance with section 23 of the FOI Act. Note the grounds on which access has been refused, including the reasons which are contained in the schedule.

REASON FOR REFUSAL The redacted information is the personal affairs of one or more individuals residing at Marsh Court, NOVAR GARDENS. The information relates to the details of a SACAD event code, which is considered confidential and sensitive. I am of the view that disclosure of such information is unreasonable given the need to protect the privacy of a resident or residents.		



CLAUSE FOR REFUSAL

Clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act which states:

"A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead)."

Your rights to review

If you are dissatisfied with this determination, you are entitled to exercise your right of internal review in accordance with section 29(1) of the FOI Act by completing a PD362 Application for Internal Review form, which can be downloaded from <https://www.police.sa.gov.au/services-and-events/freedom-of-information>, or upon request at your nearest police station. Alternatively, an application may be made in writing to the SAPOL Freedom of Information Unit or by submitting an online application [SA.GOV.AU - Make a freedom of information request](#). This application must be lodged within 30 (calendar) days after you receive this letter. The fee of \$43.30 (if applicable) can be paid in person at any South Australian police station or by posting a money order.
