SECONDARY SCHOOL ROAD SAFETY SESSIONS

The SA Police Road Safety Centre is a leader in road safety education, playing a vital role in reducing road trauma through enhancing the awareness, knowledge and skills of all road users through lifelong learning.

Despite steady falls in the lives lost on South Australian roads over the past decade, young drivers continue to be over-represented in road trauma statistics. Obtaining a licence is a very exciting time for young drivers and it is important that they are aware of licence conditions and safe driving practices.

The Road Safety Centre delivers vital road safety sessions to all schools across the state at no cost. Sessions can be adapted to cater for students living with disability. Sessions can be conducted at the Road Safety Centre or on location.

Secondary school sessions are conducted within the school environment. Sessions can be adapted to cater for students living with disability. Sessions conducted at the Road Safety Centre can include the use of interactive technology including the driving simulator and photo booth. The session time for Road Safety Centre sessions is approximately 2 hours.

Year 7, 8 & 9: How to be safe on the road - road safety session (45 minutes)

This session is designed to get students thinking about road safety. Students are presented with information on passenger responsibilities, pedestrian safety, cycling safety, the use of wheeled recreational devices, being safe around public transport and an introduction to the graduated licensing scheme and the Fatal Five causes of road trauma in South Australia.

Year 10: A guide to obtaining your driver's licence - road safety session

(90 minutes)

This session is designed to be delivered to students who are about to or have just obtained their learner's permit. Students are presented with information on the graduated licencing scheme and the conditions associated with a learner's permit and provisional licence. Other topics include the Fatal Five, risk-taking behaviour, peer group pressure, passenger safety and the consequences of making poor choices on the road.

Year 11: Youth driver education - road safety session

(90 minutes)

This session aims to reduce the risk of being involved in a crash and highlights choices, risks and consequences on all aspects of road use. Students will view 'Driven – the story of Holly Scott'. Driven highlights Holly's recovery from serious injuries sustained in a crash that almost took her life. Topics also include crash statistics and the Fatal Five causes of road trauma in South Australia.

Year 12: Getting home safely - road safety session

(90 minutes)

This session is designed to empower students to make informed choices and decisions through discussion after listening to segments of SAPOL's podcast 'Fatal Five: True Stories – The Story of Nicholas Holbrook'. This session also includes the Fatal Five causes of road trauma in South Australia, driver fatigue, Schoolies Festival and ANCAP safety ratings.
