
In relation to my determination letter dated 18 June 2018 regarding this application, I have been advised by the manager of Expiation Notice Branch that the data supplied was incorrect and inadvertently included both fixed and mobile speed camera data, not just fixed camera data as per your request.

The following table contains the corrected data and shows the number and the value of speeding fines from fixed camera for 2017 and 2018 to 14 May 2018.


