Jeff the Road Safety Dog can be used in many ways to help reinforce road safety messages to students.

Here are some suggestions:

- Use Jeff the Road Safety Dog as a class mascot and acknowledge the class student
 of the week by allowing that student to take Jeff home for the weekend. Ask them to write
 about what they did with Jeff during that weekend and include some photos of Jeff
 modelling good road safety behaviour. Print the downloadable resources from
 www.police.sa.gov.au/your-safety/road-safety/road-safety-resources and place them in
 a folder for the students to complete during the weekend. Students can take photos of
 Jeff the Road Safety Dog and write in a class journal about their adventures together. Print
 the 'introduction sheet for parent and caregivers' to include in the folder.
- As a class, present your visit to the Road Safety Centre to the school assembly. Use Jeff the Road Safety Dog to teach other members of your school community about road safety.
- As a class, write a an article about your visit to the Road Safety Centre to parents and care givers. Use Jeff the Road Safety Dog to promote road safety to your community.
- Write a story about Jeff the Road Safety Dog, draw a picture or make a poster of Jeff to keep in your classroom journal about road safety. Talk about or draw Jeff the Road Safety Dog behaving correctly whilst:
 - using a crossing safely
 - being safe around public transport
 - playing in a safe place
 - understanding bike safety
 - being a passenger in a car
 - calling triple zero.
