**Re: Freedom of Information Act application**

In reference to your application made pursuant to the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act 1991, access was sought to:

*"Any and all documents and internal correspondence (including, but not limited to, emails, minutes, briefings, letters and notes) regarding any State Government funding allocated to South Australia Police, to specifically target the manufacture and/or importation and/or supply of crystal methamphetamine (ice). Specifically: • The total amount of State Government funding allocated to SAPOL to target crystal methamphetamine (ice) in 2018/19; • Monies expended by SAPOL on programs specific to crystal methamphetamine (ice) in 2018/19, and the details of that expenditure; • Monies projected to be expended by SAPOL in 2019/20 and 2020/21, on programs specific to crystal methamphetamine (ice), and the details of that expenditure; and • Programs and/or any activity developed in response to the funding allocated and any relevant commencement dates, aims, objectives, relevant timeframes and forward planning, and details of allocation of resources within these programs."*

Pursuant to Section 26 of the FOI Act, consultation was undertaken with third parties recorded within the documents to seek their views regarding the release of their personal affairs to a third party. Some expressed objection to the release of their personal affairs. Attempts to contact other parties have been unsuccessful. Therefore it is determined not to release details of parties listed within the documents pursuant to Clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act.

South Australia Police (SAPOL) has located documents that fall within the scope of your request. The documents are numbered and described in the following schedule. The schedule contains the details of the determination in compliance with section 23. In particular, note the grounds on which access has been refused, including the reasons which are contained in the schedule.



## COMMISSIONER'S BRIEFING PAPER

**SUBJECT:** Purchase of Handheld Narcotic Analysers (TruNarc)

### BACKGROUND

The hand held narcotics analysers (HNA) have been in use within SAPOL since April 2014. Between 2014 and 2016 SAPOL purchased twelve HNA's for use in metropolitan Local Service Areas (LSA) and three for Serious & Organised Crime Branch. SAPOL purchased the brand of HNA called "TruNarc". These devices are utilised extensively by Law Enforcement Agencies throughout Australia and internationally. In 2017 the Ministerial Crystal Methamphetamine Taskforce recommended to the government that SAPOL be provided funds to purchase a further seven HNA's for use in country LSA's.

### RELEVANT POINTS

- In June 2017 the Ministerial Crystal Methamphetamine Taskforce recommended to the Government that SAPOL be provided funds to purchase a further seven HNA's for use in country locations. The cost of each unit is approximately \$37,500.00. SAPOL purchased an extra HNA from its existing budget. The eight new HNA's were received in December 2017. SAPOL now has a total of 23 HNA's. The HNA's are in the following locations;
  - 12 HNA's – metropolitan LSA'S (two at each LSA)
  - 3 HNA's – Serious & Organised Crime Branch
  - 1 HNA – Heavy Vehicle Enforcement Section
  - 7 HNA's – country LSA's (funds for purchase from Ministerial Crystal Methamphetamine Taskforce)
- The use of HNA's is premised upon utilising technology to increase the effectiveness and efficiency within the investigation environment and to generate cost savings within SAPOL's current operating framework.
- The HNA's provides rapid identification of illicit drugs and precursors using Raman (laser) Spectroscopy. It provides non-contact sampling, minimises contamination and exposure and preserves evidence. The device identifies narcotics, stimulants, depressants, hallucinogens and analgesics.
- The HNA projects a small laser light into the substance which is scattered into patterns according to the substance's chemical compound. Each chemical compound has its own 'signature' which when compared with those in the analysers internal digital library enables rapid identification.
- The HNA provides the capacity to immediately identify over 415 substances allowing investigators to proceed with investigation and charging processes with some certainty. The substance is then seized and forwarded to FSSA for positive chemical testing for Court purposes.

- Police in the course of drug investigations are potentially exposed to hazardous and poisonous substances. Some of these substances and materials can be volatile, toxic, corrosive, flammable, explosive or carcinogenic and pose a health risk during their seizure, transportation and storage.
- Early identification of the potential hazardous materials is critical in maintaining officer and community safety. These HNA's provide immediate presumptive testing that greatly enhances safe handling.
- Importantly these HNA's enable non-contact sampling and can scan directly through plastic or glass to minimize contamination, reduce exposure and preserve evidence. They have particular relevance when investigating clandestine drug laboratories. They enable officers to quickly distinguish between classes of drugs that are similar in appearance such as cocaine, heroin and methamphetamine.
- The emergence of new highly toxic drugs such as fentanyl are steadily finding their way into the Australian illicit drug market. SAPOL has recently had to deal with fentanyl seizures in both metropolitan and rural environments. Fentanyl is highly toxic and an overdose can lead to disorientation, respiratory problems, unconsciousness and even death.
- The increased illicit use of fentanyl means SAPOL members have an increased chance of encountering this illicit substance. These hand held devices provide presumptive testing and therefore greatly enhances police officer, emergency service staff and community safety when dealing with substances like fentanyl as they limit the airborne exposure to these dangerous drugs.
- A short video for media release showing the HNA in operation has been prepared by SAPOL. This will be distributed to media outlets when the Premier makes his announcement regarding the purchase of the HNA's at Whyalla on 24 January 2018.
- Training & Development Coordinators in each LSA will be responsible for the training of staff and maintenance and updating of the HNA's.

## COMMISSIONERS BRIEFING PAPER

**SUBJECT:** Ministerial request for information relating to the Ministerial Crystal Methamphetamine Taskforce

### BACKGROUND:

The Hon Joe Szakacs MP has written to the Minister for Police, Essential Services and Correction Services the Hon Corey Wingard MP on behalf of his constituent [REDACTED] of Woodville North seeking an update regarding the Ministerial Crystal Methamphetamine Taskforce and its outcomes.

The Ministerial Crystal Methamphetamine Taskforce also known as "Stop the Hurt." was established in February 2017 by the previous Government to identify and recommend policy and legislative measures that could provide a swift response to address the increasing use of Crystal Methamphetamine within the South Australian community. The Taskforce was made up of members from the then Government, SAPOL, Attorney Generals Department and Drug and Alcohol Service South Australia. Recommendations were provided to the then Premier at the beginning of May 2017. In June 2017 there were 23 initiatives identified for action of which six were issued to SAPOL.

### RELEVANT POINTS:

- The 23 initiatives were divided between SAPOL, Attorney General's Department and the Drug and Alcohol Service South Australia. The actions were assigned according to the area of expertise or responsibility. The actions assigned to SAPOL were;

#### 1. Targeted investigation into Organised Crime syndicates

The Taskforce recommended SAPOL undertake investigations into Organised Crime Syndicates that are involved in the manufacturing and trafficking of crystal methamphetamine. These operations were to be provided appropriate resources to undertake investigations. This has occurred successfully with a number of persons charged with serious drug offences.

#### 2. Additional drug dogs and handlers

The Taskforce recommended the provision for two additional drug dogs and handlers. Two new handlers and two new dogs have been trained and have been operational since April 2018.

### **3. Statewide Crime Stoppers Campaign**

The Taskforce recommended that a state wide media campaign in conjunction with Crimestoppers should be undertaken to allow the community to report persons involved in the sale of crystal methamphetamine. Crime Stoppers 'Make The Call' campaign was officially launched on the 13 February 2018 and concluded on 31 August 2018. Local launches were conducted in the following rural areas of Murray Bridge, Riverland, the Iron Triangle (Port Pirie, Port Augusta, Whyalla), Port Lincoln and Mount Gambier. SAPOL undertook appropriate action with regards to the information supplied by the public.

### **4. TruNarc for country Local Service Areas**

The Taskforce recommended that SAPOL be provided funds to purchase devices for the preliminary testing of substances. Seven TruNarc instruments were purchased and distributed to the country LSA's for operational use.

### **5. Amend Controlled Substances Act 1984 (mandatory reporting)**

Precursor chemicals – Thirty-one chemicals which can be used in the manufacture of illicit drugs were added to legislation providing for their sale to be subject to regulation. This new legislation began on 1 July 2018.

Sale of Glassware – Industry consultation with sellers and manufacturers was required before drafting amendments for mandatory reporting of sales of laboratory glassware and equipment that could be used to manufacture illicit substances. SAPOL has deferred consultation until future discussions are held with the current Government as to whether there is a desire to progress this legislation.

### **6. Amend Road Traffic Act 1961 (vehicle searches)**

The Taskforce considered amendments to enable police to search a person or their vehicle for illicit substances if the driver returned a positive roadside drug test. Parliament rejected the proposed legislation and the matter has been left in abeyance.

- SAPOL also conducts Operation Atlas 2018-20 which is also designed to address law enforcement actions and initiatives under the National Ice Strategy 2015, the National Organised Crime Response Plan 2015-2018, 2015 National Law Enforcement Methylamphetamine Strategy (OP Vitreus) and the Ministerial Crystal Methamphetamine Taskforce.
- Other initiative outcomes requested in the letter will need to be obtained from other Government Departments who had the responsibility of managing the initiatives.

- With regards to the recruiting and training of the new 313 officers this information will need to be obtained from Human Resources Management Branch
- Recommend that this briefing paper is forwarded to the Ministerial Liaison Office upon approval.
