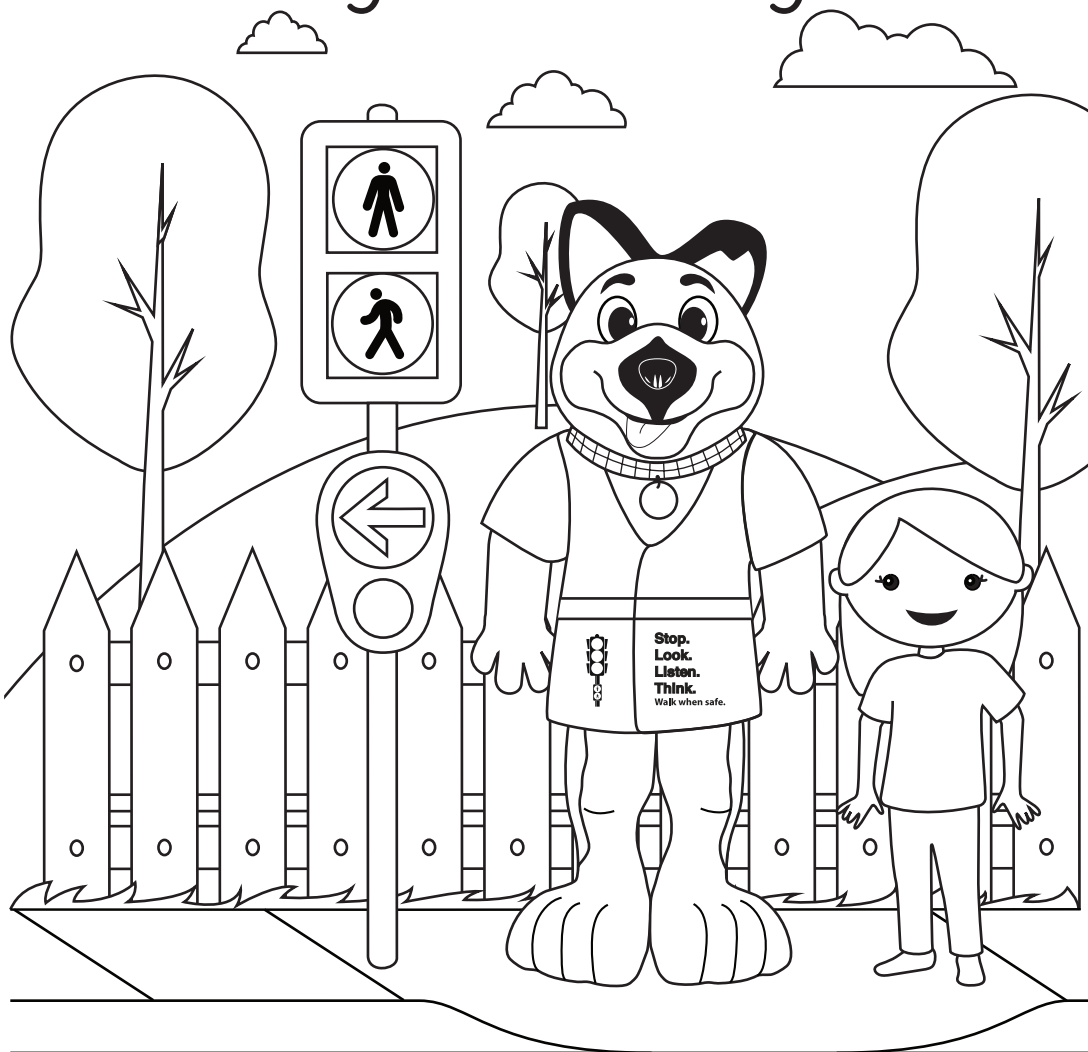




Jeff Can Help

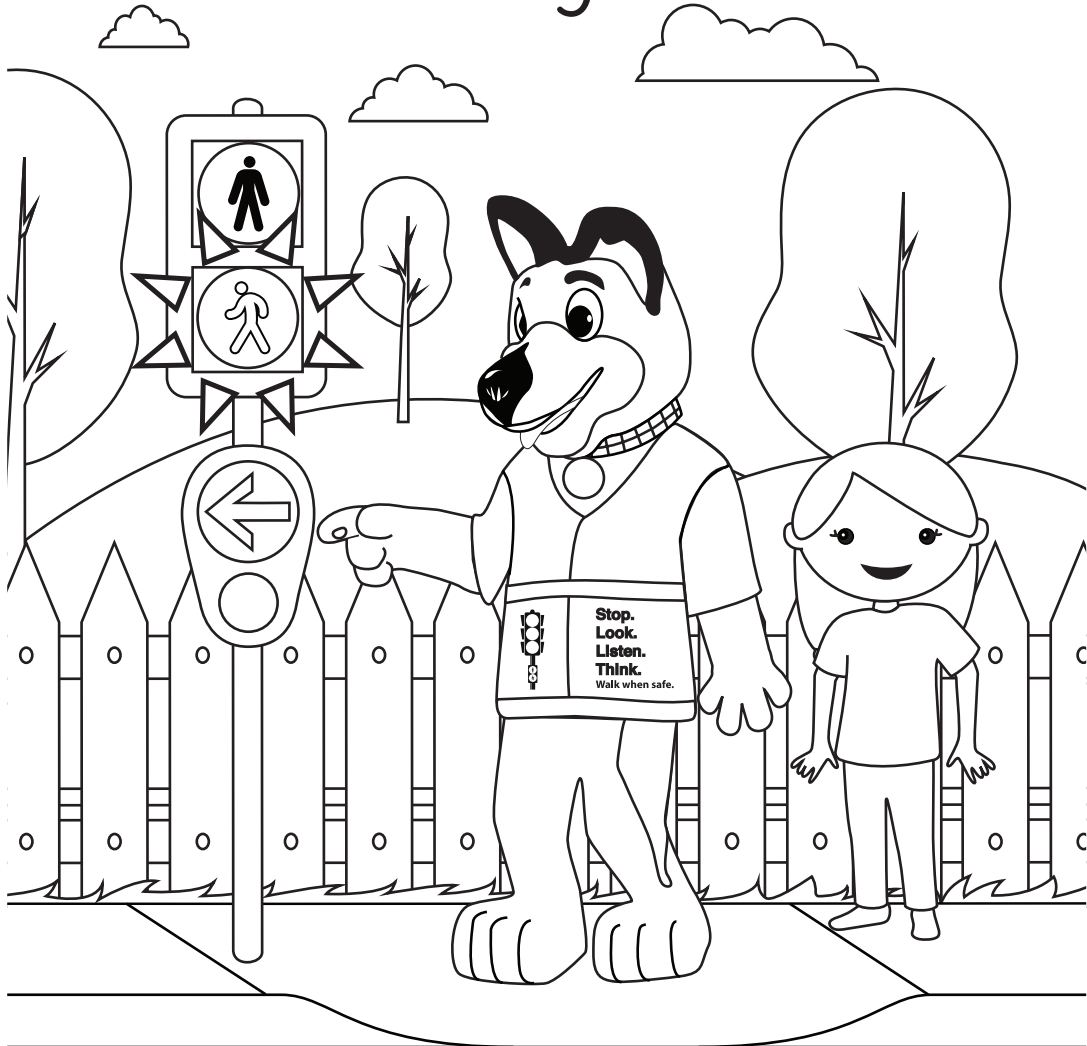


Jill needs to cross.

come to a stop.

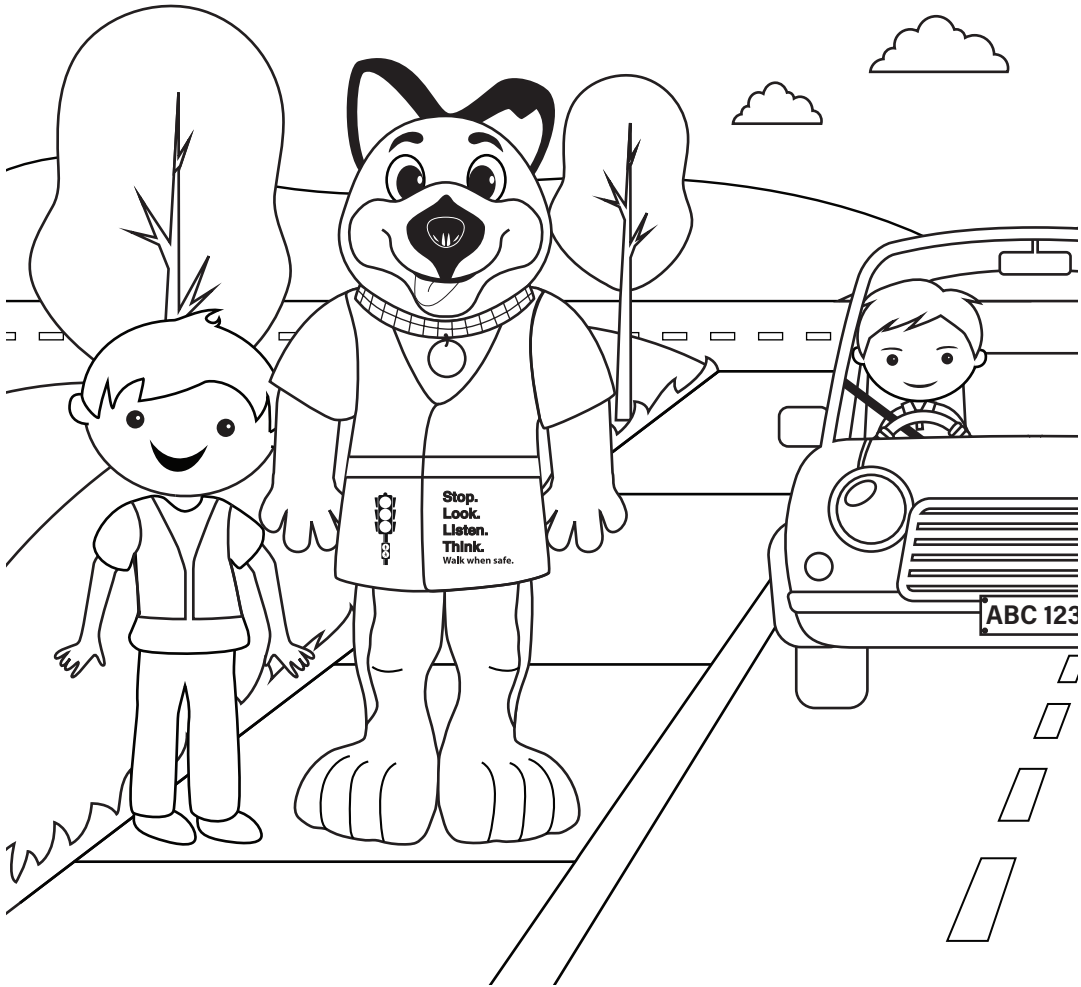


Jeff and Jill can cross.

Stop. Look. Listen. Think.

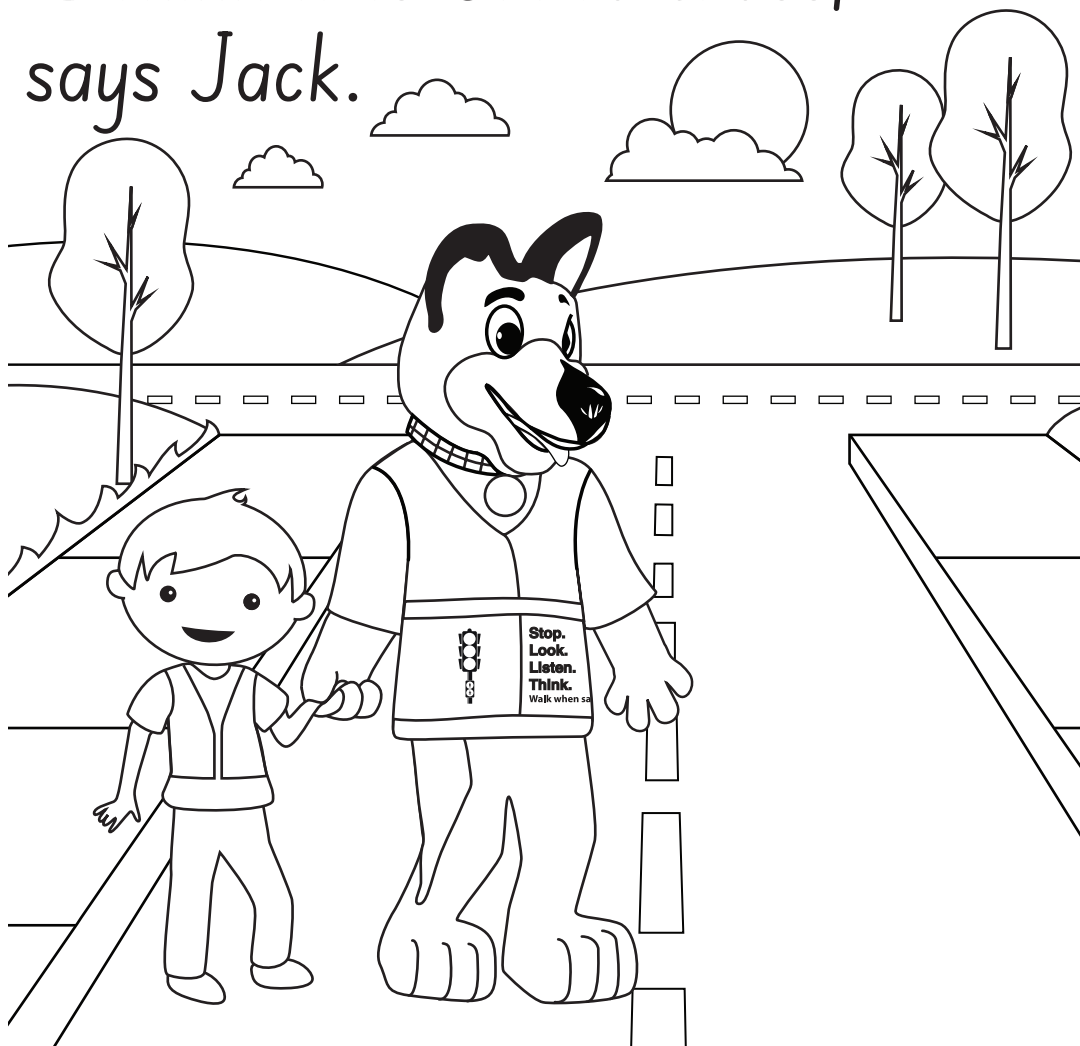


Jeff says, "Hold my hand."

HOW TO CROSS THE ROAD SAFELY

Tips for parents/guardians

It is important to ensure your child is aware of the dangers when crossing the road.

Please always reinforce the following tips:

- Always use a pedestrian crossing if one is nearby.
- Press the pedestrian button only once.
- Do the kerb drill, even when you have a green light to cross. Vehicles don't always stop when they should. Ensure your child does 'stop, look, listen, think':
 - **STOP** and step back from the road and never on or in the kerb.
 - **LOOK** to the right, then to the left and then to the right again to make sure the road is clear of traffic.
 - **LISTEN** for cars, trucks, buses, motorbikes, scooters, cyclists, trains, trams or any traffic at all.
 - **THINK** is it safe to cross?
- Start to cross only when the green pedestrian light is showing and only when it is safe to do so. When the red light is flashing or when the red light remains steady, do not start to cross the road. Wait until the next cycle.
