Re: Application for access to South Australia Police (SAPOL) records

I refer to your application made pursuant to the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act 1991 in which access was sought to the following information:

"Disaggregated data (categorised into Indigenous and non-Indigenous persons) for persons taken into police custody in South Australia in the last 5 years pursuant to the protective custody regime contained in Part 2 of the Public Intoxication Act 1985 (SA)."

It is determined to **release in full** disaggregated data for persons detained pursuant to the Public Intoxication Act 1985 and taken to a Police Station during the last five (5) years. This data has been presented in the table below and was correct as at 30 October 2019.

Alternatively an application must be lodged within 30 days from the date of this determination with a fee of \$36.75. Such a fee may be waived in the event of an exemption being claimed.
