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Dear Ms Sandy

In reference to your application made pursuant to the *Freedom of Information Act* 1991 (FOI Act), access was sought to:

"Documents, specifically reports, statistics, showing the cost incurred in 2021 and 2022 respectively by SA Police to repair/clean-up police assets which have sustained malicious damage. Please exclude duplicates, documents that have already been publicly released, media releases /reports/articles and correspondence with media. If emails are captured, please limit to the final thread of the conversation. If there are multiple briefing notes on the same topic, please limit to the most recent, along with any attachments. Please note, I do not consent to documents being deemed irrelevant without consultation."

On 28 February 2023, in response to my email, you agreed to narrow the scope of your request to:

- "• Costs incurred in 2021 and 2022 by SA Police to repair/clean-up assets which have sustained malicious damage;
- A list of the Occurrence reports in which malicious property damage was reported and recorded on Shield (SAPOL's record management system), including the brief summary recorded by the officer with all third party information redacted;
- A random selection of 10 Occurrence reports from the list with third party information redacted; and
- Any footage associated to the malicious damage as identified in the summary of the Occurrence Reports"





# In relation to this part of your request:

"Costs incurred in 2021 and 2022 by SA Police to repair/clean-up assets which have sustained malicious damage;"

SAPOL report the <u>approximate\*</u> costs incurred in 2021-2022 by SA Police to repair/clean-up assets which have sustained <u>non-accidental</u>\*\* damage as follows:

Damage to police vehicles \$98 006 Damage to police property <u>\$14 709</u> Total approximate costs \$112 715

\*The value for damage to police vehicles is actual costs. However the value for police property is a combination of actual costs and costs estimated at the time of reporting.

\*\*The results supplied are in relation to non-accidental damage rather than malicious damage as malicious intent cannot always be ascertained.

## In relation to this part of your request:

- "• A list of the Occurrence reports in which malicious property damage was reported and recorded on Shield (SAPOL's record management system), including the brief summary recorded by the officer with all third party information redacted;
- A random selection of 10 Occurrence reports from the list with third party information redacted; and
- Any footage associated to the malicious damage as identified in the summary of the Occurrence Reports"
