PRESCHOOL AND PRIMARY SCHOOL ROAD SAFETY SESSIONS

The SA Police Road Safety Centre is a leader in road safety education, playing a vital role in reducing road trauma through enhancing the awareness, knowledge and skills of all road users through lifelong learning.

The SA Police Road Safety Centre provides education on pedestrian, cycle and road safety, including road rules, to preschools, primary schools and community groups. These sessions can be tailored to meet the needs of specific groups. Sessions can be adapted to cater for students living with disability. They are delivered by police officers and are presented at the Road Safety Centre and off-site. At the Road Safety Centre there is a mock roadway which is a safe environment for participants to become familiar with road signs, pedestrian safety and road rules. There are no costs for participants and all equipment is supplied when the sessions are conducted at the Road Safety Centre.

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SA Police Road Safety Centre Preschool and Primary School Sessions

'Introduction to road safety' sessions can be conducted within the school environment but will not feature the practical riding and pedestrian safety on the mock roadway. The session time for school environment sessions is approximately 45 minutes.

Preschool students – Keeping safe on the road

- Introduction to road safety session

(90 minutes)

This session provides students with an introduction to road safety, how to identify police officers and when to call Triple Zero in an emergency. Students are introduced to 'Jeff the Road Safety Dog' who through the use of videos highlights important road safety messages. This session is conducted at the Road Safety Centre and includes practical riding and pedestrian safety on the mock roadway. All equipment is supplied.

Primary school students- Reception to Year 3 – Keeping safe on the road

- Introduction to road safety session

(90 minutes)

This session discusses playing in safe places, the kerb drill, wearing seatbelts, wearing a safety helmet and how to be safe around public transport. Students are introduced to 'Jeff the Road Safety Dog' who through the use of videos highlights important road safety messages. This session is conducted at the Road Safety Centre and includes practical riding and pedestrian safety on the mock roadway. All equipment is supplied.

Primary school students - Year 4 to Year 6 – Road safety with SA Police

- Introduction to road safety session

(90 minutes)

This session provides information on road safety and the Australian Road Rules. It discusses the appropriate use of wheeled recreational devices through the concept of Cycle Safe and SMILE. It also educates students on how to be safe around public transport and when to call Triple Zero in an emergency. This session is conducted at the Road Safety Centre and includes practical riding and pedestrian safety on the mock roadway. All equipment is supplied.

School crossing monitor training

For students / teachers / volunteers

(45 minutes)

This training is delivered to students aged 10 years and above, teachers and school volunteers who are required to operate a school crossing or pedestrian-activated traffic lights. Training takes place at the students' school and is valid for a 12-month period.



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
