






When crossing the road you should always:

- wear bright clothing
- stand back from the kerb
- hold hands with an adult
- ALWAYS do the kerb drill before crossing
- ALWAYS use a pedestrian crossing when there is one nearby
- only start to cross when the green person is showing
- never start to cross when the red person is showing.

- 5. Child crossing road, running ahead of parent.




