Neighbourhood Watch SA Role Statement

SAPOL VOLUNTEERING PRINCIPLES

Activities involving volunteers are to comply with the following principles:

- 1. Support SAPOL goals & objectives
- 2. Are inclusive of diverse communities aligning to SAPOL's people strategies and plans
- 3. Are clearly defined, safe and effectively managed.
- 4. Support, but not substitute paid work.
- 5. Do not involve the exercise of statutory police powers and authority.
- 6. Are of a nature that is of value to the volunteer, SAPOL and the community

RANGE OF ACTIVITIES

Activities include (but not restricted to):

- Assist with administration of Neighbourhood Watch SA activities which may include undertaking duties as outlined in the Community Crime Prevention Program Manual
- Undertake Neighbourhood Watch SA Committee member roles including Area Coordinator, Secretary, Treasurer and Newsletter Editor
- Undertake other approved Neighbourhood Watch SA community based activities including traffic marshalling at Australia Day Parades, assisting with graffiti removal and Neighbourhood Watch newsletter delivery.

- Ability to work harmoniously with others
- Punctual
- Reliable
- Honest

ALL VOLUNTEERS ARE REQUIRED TO:

- Satisfy National Police Clearance certification
- Abide by the South Australia Police (SAPOL) Volunteer Agreement conditions
- Behave in a manner consistent with the Public Sector Volunteer Principles of Conduct, and the SAPOL Standards of Conduct for Police Volunteers
- Complete Police Volunteer Program training courses, and other approved training required for a Neighbourhood Watch SA volunteer role
- Be managed and supported by SAPOL members.
