Freedom of Information Act application

In reference to your application made pursuant to the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act 1991, access was sought to:

"I'm seeking documents, specifically reports, audits, correspondence including emails, meeting minutes, executive briefings and attachments relating to one or more of the following: 1. Unidentified human remains; 2. The National DNA Program for Unidentified and Missing Persons. Please exclude duplicates, documents that have already been publicly released, media reports/article/statements and any correspondence with media. I consent to edited copies of documents/video with exempt material redacted/pixilated. Please note, I do not consent to documents or information in documents being deemed irrelevant without consultation. Please limit searches to the Commissioner, the head of the Missing Persons Unit and the Deputy Commissioner in charge of the Missing Persons Unit. Timeframe: 1 August, 2020 to the date of the (sic) this application."

On 30 October 2020 a Notice of Estimated Charges was sent advising the words 'Unidentified human remains' and 'National DNA' would be used as search terms.

In an email on 12 January 2021 I sought your views regarding excluding the personal affairs of third parties. On 12 January 2021 you replied, "I'm happy to have personal details of third parties deemed irrelevant except for the names of people missing." These personal affairs of third parties have been redacted and marked Out of Scope.

Pursuant to Section 25 of the FOI Act, consultation was undertaken with Australian Federal Police and the South Australian Attorney General's Department regarding the release of information contained in documents. Their views have been taken into account when making this determination.

South Australia Police (SAPOL) has located documents that are associated with the wording of your FOI application. The documents are numbered and described in the following schedule. The schedule contains the details of the determination in compliance with section 23. In particular, note the grounds on which access has been refused, including the reasons which are contained in the schedule.

This determination was made on 25 February 2021.



COMMISSIONERS BRIEFING PAPER

SUBJECT:

Australian Federal Police – National DNA Program for Unidentified Human Remains and Missing Persons

BACKGROUND:

In August 2020 the Australian Federal Police (AFP) National Missing Persons Coordination Centre (NMPCC) was provided \$3.594 million under the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 to undertake a National DNA program for missing persons (MP) and unidentified human remains (UHR).

RELEVANT POINTS:

- The NMPCC is leading the program in consultation with out of score who is an Australian internationally recognised expert in the DNA identification of missing persons. The program is being supported by existing national databases developed by the Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission.
- It is intended that required testing will be conducted at the AFP Forensic Complex in Canberra by DNA specialists with expertise in the DNA identification of skeletal remains.
- MCIB have been briefed by the NMPCC and score regarding the intent and scope of the program. In support of the program MCIB have provided the NMPCC statistics regarding UHR and long term missing persons (LTMP).
- There are currently 19 UHR on file with Missing Persons Investigation Section (MPIS). SAPOL have been engaged with Forensic Science South Australia (FSSA) since 2018 as part Operation Persevere to identify UHR by uploading DNA from the remains to the National DNA database.
- MPIS are managing 139 LTMP and have had work conducted on LTMP in an attempt to obtain suitable DNA profiles for uploading to the National Criminal Investigation DNA database (NCIDD). To date DNA of about 45 LTMP have been uploaded. MCIB are in the process of back capturing further DNA samples obtained from relatives of LTMP for uploading to the NCIDD.
- All UHR and LTMP profiles are uploaded to the National Missing Persons and Victims System database.

- MCIB have consulted Forensic Science South Australia (FSSA) and MPIS intend to continue to meet with FSSA to discuss and progress individual cases as required.
- The intention of the National initiative is supported and it is intended that MPIS will continue to manage LTMP and UHR in consultation with FSSA and engage the AFP on a needs basis where circumstances require testing that falls outside the current capacity of FSSA.

2,2 RESPONSIBILITIES

The UHR Project Steering Committee provides direction, implementation support and mitigates risks and issues by supplying appropriate resources to establish and develop capability within the restraints of the approved POCA funding.

The Steering Committee will achieve this by:

- making decisions and authorising any necessary scope changes
- adequately representing the business, user and supplier interests
- providing guidance, assurance and resolving any issues
- approving the appropriate allocation of resources to the project(s)
- monitor the progress to ensure the required outcomes and benefits are achieved and are in line with the approved bid.

It should be noted that the Steering Committee will focus on project delivery elements and not the operational or day-to-day business interactions of the Project.

2.2.1 Chair responsibilities

Program Justification:

The National DNA Program for Unidentified and Missing Persons will use contemporary forensic techniques to support law enforcement to:

- Establish the identity, and cause of death, of Australia's unidentified human remains
- Solve long-term cold cases of missing and deceased Australians
- Provide answers to Australian families with missing relatives
- Facilitate the burial of human remains long-held in their custody

Research¹ shows 38,000 Australians are reported missing each year. A small percentage of those reported missing have never been located. Currently in Australia, it is estimated that there are approximately 2600 active long-term missing persons cases and 500 sets of untested unidentified human remains. However, the majority of these remains have been archived as cold cases for decades and have never been examined using the most up-to-date forensic techniques, including current DNA technologies.

In 2015, the Australian and New Zealand Policing Advisory Agency (ANZPAA) published a Missing Persons Policy² for police, with the aim of providing national consistency in the management and investigation of missing persons cases. The policy advocates "a coordinated, national and cross-jurisdictional approach between police, government and private sector organisations is essential for the effective management and resolution of missing persons cases".

The Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission (ACIC) unveiled the National Missing Persons and Victim System (NMPVS) this same year. The NMPVS provides police and other law enforcement agencies with the ability to conduct national searches of the metadata (i.e. non-genetic data) associated with unidentified human remains and long-term missing persons.

When a person is reported missing or human remains are found, the national centralisation and comparison of the genetic data associated with these cases is also crucial for making identifications. INTERPOL recommends³ that member countries should provide adequate resources to implement a national DNA identification program to identify their missing and deceased persons.

University of Technology Sydney) published⁴ recommendations for the establishment of an Australian DNA identification program based on international best practice. OUT OF SCOPE proposed national program is modelied on the University of North Texas Center for Human Identification program for the identification of missing and unidentified persons in the United States. This facility processes up to 1000 bone samples and 2000 family reference samples per year, resulting in the identification of over 2000 missing persons to date.

Modern DNA techniques now enable the successful recovery and profiling of DNA from old and degraded human remains. This program will perform nuclear, mitochondrial and Y chromosome DNA testing of bones and associated reference samples using state-of-the-

art equipment to deliver a high-throughput, cost-effective and genetically informative identification workflow.

This DNA-led identification approach relies on relevant reference DNA samples being available for comparison to DNA recovered from the human remains. To facilitate the collection of direct or relative reference samples, this program could assist State and Territory Police organise a meeting in each capital city where relatives will be invited to provide DNA reference samples in the form of buccal swabs or personal effects from their missing relative, dental records (or dentist details), and biographical information for direct entry into the NMPVS. This model has been used successfully in the United States to further missing persons investigations.

In June 2018, the ACIC released an enhanced National Criminal Investigation DNA Database (NCiDD) capability termed NCIDD Integrated Forensic Analysis (NCIDD-IFA), which will facilitate the national searching of DNA profiles from unknown deceased, missing persons and their relatives. This is the first time Australian forensic agencies have had the capability to perform kinship searches of DNA profiles from unknown deceased and relatives of missing persons.

The NMPVS and NCIDD-IFA will facilitate the national sharing, comparing and matching of both metadata and genetic data associated with missing persons casework. However, the efficacy of these databases will be dependent on the quality and quantity of information entered, and how efficiently that information is made available for searching. It is essential that both of these databases be imminently populated with data from all of Australia's unidentified human remains and long-term missing persons (or their relatives) in order for identifications to be made.

DNA testing remains the only solution for determining if any of Australia's long-term missing children and adults are represented amongst these untested bones. Additionally, a DNA-led program would realise valuable savings in police resources required to investigate these cold cases, by providing timely and definitive DNA identifications in the absence of any other intelligence information.

The program will also facilitate the anthropological and odonotological examination of the remains to not only assist with establishing identity, but the cause and manner of death where possible, offering support to criminal and death investigations. For those human remains that cannot be identified through DNA matching, other forensic techniques will be applied to offer new investigative leads. These include radiocarbon dating, forensic DNA phenotyping, craniofacial reconstructions and forensic genetic genealogy.

Program Proposal:

The AFP's National Missing Persons Coordination Centre (NMPCC) submitted a bid for funding from the Confiscated Assets Account for a National DNA Program for Unidentified and Missing Persons.

The AFP is the Sponsoring Agency of the program and the NSW Forensic and Analytical Science Service (FASS) will be the main DNA testing service provider.

The program will run for 2.5 years, commencing in Jan 2020.

The program will have four dedicated staff:

- Program Lead
- 3x DNA Analysts

Specialist forensic experts will be contracted as required.

Aims:

The objective of this program is to forensically examine and identify Australia's unidentified human remains using a combination of forensic human identification techniques.

The specific aims of this program are:

- 1. To audit all active unidentified human remains and long-term missing persons cases in each jurisdiction, with the metadata entered into the NMPVS.
- 2. To conduct anthropological and odontological examinations of unidentified human remains (if not examined previously), with results entered into the NMPVS.
- To collect direct and/or relative DNA reference samples for each long-term missing person for entry into the NCIDD-IFA.
- 4. To assist police organise an event for families and friends of the missing to facilitate collection of ante-mortem data.
- 5. To conduct DNA testing (including nuclear DNA, mitochondrial DNA and Y chromosome DNA testing) of missing person-related reference samples (if not subject to the full complement of DNA testing previously), with results entered into the NCIDD-IFA.
- 6. To conduct DNA testing (including nuclear DNA, mitochondrial DNA and Y chromosome DNA testing) of unidentified human remains (if not subject to the full complement of DNA testing previously), with results entered into the NCIDD-IFA.
- 7. To submit missing person-related DNA profiles to the INTERPOL DNA Database for international searching via the AFP DNA Gateway.
- 8. To conduct radiocarbon dating of selected unidentified human remains to assist to determine date of birth and death.
- 9. To conduct forensic DNA phenotyping of selected unidentified human remains to assist to determine genetic ancestry, hair colour, eye colour and skin colour.

- 10. To conduct craniofacial reconstructions of selected unidentified human remains to assist to determine facial appearance.
- 11. To conduct forensic genetic genealogy of selected unidentified human remains to assist to identify relatives.

State and Territory Police Support:

- 1. Complete an audit of all active unidentified human remains and long-term missing persons cases and ensure the relevant metadata for each case (including antemortem dental records) is entered into the NMPVS for national searching and matching purposes within approx. 3 months of the commencement of the program.
- 2. Submit all unidentified human remains to FASS for forensic examination and testing within approx. 6 months of the commencement of the program. Prior to DNA testing, the program team will arrange for the human remains to be examined by a Forensic Anthropologist and/or Odontologist either within each jurisdiction or at FASS. Where possible, a Forensic Anthropologist will determine the sex, ancestry, stature, age at death, time since death, and detect any skeletal damage that may be attributable to cause and manner of death and upload this information to the NMPVS for national searching and matching purposes. A Forensic Odontologist will conduct a dental examination and upload the post-mortem dental record to the NMPVS for national searching and matching purposes. After DNA testing, the program team will enter the DNA profiles into the NCIDD-IFA for national searching and matching purposes.
- 3. Collect direct (e.g. newborn screening cards) and/or suitable family reference samples (as advised by the program team) for each long-term missing person and submit them to FASS for DNA testing within approximately 12 months of the commencement of the program. The program team will enter the DNA profiles into the NCIDD-IFA for national searching and matching purposes. The program team could also assist police organise an event for families of the missing to facilitate collection of family reference samples and other relevant ante-mortem information to aid investigations. This could coincide with National Missing Persons Week 2020.
- 4. Organise and fund the transport of unidentified human remains and DNA reference samples to and from FASS.
- 5. Prepare the necessary documentation for the coronial process in their jurisdiction if a DNA match report is provided to them from FASS (or their local forensic DNA laboratory based on DNA testing results from FASS).
- 6. Consider additional specialist forensic testing for those human remains that are not identified during the program as advised by the program team (if such testing is not able to be conducted as part of the program).
- 7. Consider exhumations of: a) unidentified human remains that were interred without a biological sample ever being collected, stored or tested (and therefore have no DNA profile on record); and b) relative/s of those long-term missing persons that have no living relatives to provide a family reference sample for comparison.





The Australian Federal Police (AFP) National Missing Persons Coordination Centre (NMPCC) has recently been provided \$3.594m under the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 to undertake a National DNA Program for Unidentified and Missing Persons (the Program). The 2.5 year Program commenced on 1 July 2020 and uses contemporary forensic techniques to support law enforcement to:

- establish the identity, and cause and manner of death, of Australia's unidentified human remains;
- solve long-term cold cases of missing and deceased Australians;
- provide answers to Australian families with missing relatives; and
- facilitate the burial of human remains long-held in custody.

an Australian Internationally recognised expert in the

DNA identification of missing persons, has been engaged by the AFP to lead the Program. The Program will adhere to published best practice recommendations for the establishment of a national DNA program for unidentified and missing persons, and strengthen the cross-jurisdictional response needed to solve these cold cases.

Testing will be conducted at the AFP Forensic Complex in Canberra using methodology outlined in the attached Program summary (Attachment A).

The Program will be supported by existing national databases developed by the Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission (ACIC), and their enhanced use will facilitate the national sharing, comparing and matching of both metadata and genetic data associated with unidentified and missing persons cases. The databases include the:

- National Missing Persons and Victim System (NMPVS);
- National Criminal Investigation DNA Database (NCIDD); and
- NCIDD-Integrated Forensic Analysis (NIFA).

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The funds provided by the Federal Government, while significant, will not cover the total costs of a program of this scale. We will require cross-jurisdictional collaboration to ensure the success of the Program. Attachment B details the assistance we are requesting from South Australia Police.

National DNA Program for Unidentified and Missing Persons Program Summary

The Australian Federal Police (AFP) National Missing Persons Coordination Centre (NMPCC) has recently received funding under the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 to undertake a National DNA Program for Unidentified and Missing Persons. The Program will use contemporary forensic techniques to support law enforcement to:

- establish the identity, and cause and manner of death, of Australia's unidentified human remains;
- solve long-term cold cases of missing and deceased Australians;
- provide answers to Australian families with missing relatives; and
- facilitate the burial of human remains long-held in custody.

Testing will be conducted at the AFP Forensic Complex in Canberra, ACT by DNA specialists with expertise in the DNA identification of skeletal remains. The specialists will perform autosomal, mitochondrial, and Y chromosome DNA testing of human remains and associated reference DNA samples using state-of-the-art genotyping and sequencing equipment to deliver a high output, cost-effective and genetically informative identification workflow.

The Program will also facilitate the examination of the human remains by Forensic Odontologists and Anthropologists to not only assist with establishing identity, but the cause and manner of death where possible, offering support to criminal and death investigations. For those human remains that cannot be identified through dental or DNA matching, other forensic techniques will be applied to offer new investigative leads. These may include radiocarbon dating, isotope analysis, DNA phenotyping, craniofacial reconstructions and forensic genetic genealogy.

The Program aims to:

- Audit all active unidentified human remains and long-term missing persons
 cases in each jurisdiction and enter relevant case data (including dental charts if
 available) into the National Persons and Missing Persons Victim System
 (NMPVS) for national searching.
- 2. Conduct adontological examinations of missing persons dental records, with dental charts entered into the NMPVS for national searching.
- 3. Conduct odontological examinations of unidentified human remains, with dental charts entered into the NMPVS for national searching.
- Conduct anthropological examinations of unidentified human remains, with relevant anthropological data entered into the NMPVS for national searching.
- Collect optimal biological sample/s for DNA testing from each set of unidentified human remains.
- 6. Collect suitable direct and/or family reference DNA samples for each long-term missing person.

- 7. Organise a range of public engagement activities to promote unidentified and missing persons cases and facilitate collection of missing persons details for entry into the NMPVS and relevant ante-mortem data for forensic testing.
- Conduct DNA testing (including autosomal, mitochondrial and Y chromosome DNA testing) of direct and/or family reference DNA samples, with DNA profiles entered into the National Criminal Investigation DNA Database (NCIDD) and/or NCISS-Integrated Forensic Analysis (NIFA) for national searching.
- 9. Conduct DNA testing (including autosomal, mitochondrial and Y chromosome DNA testing) of unidentified human remains, with DNA profiles entered into the NCIDD and/or NIFA for national searching.
- Submit DNA profiles from direct and/or family reference DNA samples and unidentified human remains to the INTERPOL DNA Database via the AFP DNA Gateway for International searching.
- 11. Apply specialist forensic techniques to select unidentified human remains to provide investigative leads, such as radiocarbon dating, isotopic analysis, DNA phenotyping, craniofacial reconstructions and forensic genetic genealogy.
- 12. Develop, implement and promote best practices for a nationally coordinated, consistent and collaborative investigative approach for the forensic human identification of unidentified and missing persons in Australia.

National DNA Program for Unidentified and Missing Persons Jurisdictional Assistance Requirements

- Conduct an audit of all active unidentified human remains and long-term
 missing persons cases and enter the metadata for each case (including the entry
 of dental charts if available) into the NMPVS within approximately 3 months of
 the commencement of the Program.
- Submit optimal biological samples from each set of unidentified human remains
 to AFP Forensics for DNA testing within approximately 6 months of the
 commencement of the Program (note: this is to occur after the Program has
 arranged for the human remains to be examined locally by a Forensic
 Odontologist, Forensic Anthropologist and DNA Specialist).
- 3. Collect sultable direct and/or family reference DNA samples for each long-term missing person and submit them to AFP Forensics for DNA testing within approximately 12 months of the commencement of the Program.
- 4. Assist with the submission of DNA profiles to state, national and international DNA databases.
- Participate in a range of public engagement activities coordinated by the NMPCC, including a Family and Friends of Missing Persons Day to be held in each State and Territory.
- 6. Organise and fund the transport of unidentified human remains and reference DNA samples to and from the AFP Forensics Complex.
- 7. Support the use of specialist forensic techniques for select unidentified human remains that are not able to be positively identified using dental or DNA matching.
- 8. Commence the coronial process according to jurisdictional procedures if human remains are identified using forensic techniques applied during the Program.
- Support to review relevant State, Territory and/or Commonwealth legislation to improve national searching and cross-referencing of data associated with unidentified and missing persons cases.







SAPOL and FSSA both continue to use the UHR numbers rather than the SAP number for the UHR cases. In fact only 14 of the 19 current profiles have SAP numbers. I think referencing the SAP numbers to the UHR project team would only confuse them, because our SAPOL UHR profiles on the NMPVS database are all referred to by the UHR number. We have continued to use the UHR number because all of the old FSSA records use this number, this is the reference number used in old SAPOL records/gazettes, and it has quite often been written on bones/skulls to assist with identification of the remains. I can send you an updated report, but I see little value in it and may well cause confusion. Let me know. Trevor







I am writing to you in relation to correspondence from the Australian Federal Police (AFP) Commissioner dated 24 July 2020 regarding the establishment of the AFP-led National DNA Program for Unidentified and Missing Persons.

In my role as Assistant Commissioner Specialist Protective Command, I am responsible for overseeing this Australian-first Program which will use contemporary forensic techniques to support law enforcement to:

- establish the identity, and cause and manner of death, of Australia's unidentified human remains
- solve long-term cold cases of missing and deceased Australians
- provide answers to Australian families with missing relatives
- facilitate the burial of human remains long-held in custody

The AFP's National Missing Persons Coordination Centre (NMPCC) is leading the Program in partnership with Associate Professor OUT OF SCOPE and has engaged with representatives of your Missing Person's Unit to continue discussions around the Program and required support from your agency and forensic service provider to assist in achieving the aims of the program.

As the Program is now officially underway, I wanted to follow up on Commissioner Kershaw's initial correspondence and reiterate the importance of this Program, and the support it can provide to your. jurisdiction in relation to specialist forensic testing for unidentified and long-term missing persons.

I would also like to establish a quarterly conference call with your nominated senior executive representative to support and be briefed on the Program as it progresses. This would also provide an opportunity to disseminate the outcomes of the bi-annual Police Consultative Group on Missing Persons (PCGMP) meeting at an Executive level.

I look forward to hearing your thoughts on the Program and partnering with the AFP on this initiative. If you would benefit from a further briefing with myself or the Program team, I would be happy to make arrangements for this to occur.
