Re: Freedom of Information Act application

In reference to your application made pursuant to the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act 1991, access was sought to:

W/C

"All documents (including but not limited to physical, electronic, or written briefs, internal discussion papers, minutes, emails, diary entries and any other correspondence) referencing and breaking down the number of clerical errors made in expiation notices, and any costs associated. From 25/03/2018-02/03/2021"

On Wednesday 10 March 2021 Senior Sergeant First Class Gentgall spoke with of your office to clarify the scope of application. In an email dated 12 March 2021 refined the scope to seeking access to:

"Statistics relating to clerical errors made in expiation notices if available between 25/03/2018 and 02/03/21"

It is determined between 25 March 2018 and 2 March 2021 thirteen thousand and thirty three (13,033) clerical errors were made on expiation notices. The following information should be taken into account when interpreting the data

- The category clerical error includes primarily human errors however also includes 'declined' eTickets.
- Where a clerical error was identified a fresh notice was issued with the correct details.

This information was correct as at 12 March 2021.
