

Mock Roadway – Traffic Lights and Road Signs

Welcome to the mock roadway!

To help your child enjoy their time safely, we've put together some simple information about road safety and the rules they'll need to follow while riding on the track.

The mock roadway includes traffic lights, road signs and pedestrian crossings. Please take a moment when you arrive to go over the following information with your child, so they know what to do when approaching each one.

Traffic lights

RED light = STOP

Stop just behind the white line.

YELLOW light = SLOW DOWN

Slow down and prepare to stop if it's safe to do so. If you can't stop safely or you're in the intersection, keep travelling through.

GREEN light = GO

Before moving off, always check that other people have stopped and that it is safe to continue.

Road signs

Stop sign

- A white stop line is marked on the road.
- You must stop at the line, with all wheels completely still.
- Do not roll over the line, even if no one else is coming.
- Continue when safe.

Give Way sign

- Slow down as you approach.
- If another rider is coming, you must give way.
- If it's clear, you should still slow down, look carefully, and only continue when safe.



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Keep Left sign

- Always stay to the left side of the road.
- Riding on the wrong side may cause a collision.

Roundabout sign

Roundabouts are marked with a roundabout sign.

When using a roundabout, you should:

- keep left at all times
- give way to all traffic already in the roundabout
- give way to the right – that means waiting for everyone on your right to go first
- indicate when exiting (if you can).

Level crossing sign

Level crossings are marked with a level crossing sign.

If the warning lights start ringing and flashing, you must:

- stop at the stop line
- wait until the warning lights stop ringing and flashing
- always check both ways before continuing.

If you have already crossed the stop line when the bells and lights start, you should continue riding through.
