ROAD SAFETY CENTRE SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAM

The SA Police Road Safety Centre is a leader in road safety education, playing a vital role in reducing road trauma through enhancing the awareness, knowledge and skills of all road users through lifelong learning.

The SA Police Road Safety Centre offers a school holiday program aimed at primary school students. The program provides education on pedestrian and cycle safety, including road rules. The road safety school holiday program is delivered by police officers at the Road Safety Centre. The mock roadway is a key feature of the Road Safety Centre – this provides a safe environment for participants to become familiar with road signs, pedestrian safety and road rules. There are no costs for participants and all equipment is supplied.

In 2020 the SA Police Road Safety Centre school holiday program was recognised by the Australian Road Safety Foundation as the national award winner in the category of State Government Initiatives at the annual Australian Road Safety Awards.

SA Police Road Safety Centre School Holiday Program

SA Police offers a free road safety program for primary school aged children during the school holidays.

The school holiday program was held for the first time in 2018 at the Road Safety Centre and since then has proven to be very popular with spots filling quickly.

While South Australian children have the opportunity to visit the centre as part of a school excursion, not all schools participate in this program. The free school holiday program provides an additional opportunity for children to gain vital road safety education. Participants in the two-hour program will have a classroom session and a practical session on pedestrian safety and bicycle riding on the mock roadway to put into practice their newly learnt knowledge.

All equipment is supplied and the Road Safety Centre has a range of bicycles to cater for all riders and their abilities.

Two age groups are catered for and the sessions are aimed at children 5 – 8 years and 9 – 12 years. The sessions are conducted at the Road Safety Centre located at 1 Military Road, West Beach, South Australia from 10.00 am to midday and 12:30 pm and 2:30 pm on nominated dates.
