


South Australia has so many amazing and picturesque locations to visit.

If you are a tourist visiting from interstate or overseas and want to drive in South Australia, please be aware of the following road rules:

- you must carry a current driver's licence when driving in South Australia
- you must drive on the left-hand side of the road
- you and your passengers must wear a seatbelt
- in built-up areas the speed limit in South Australia is 50 km/h unless otherwise signposted
- outside built-up areas the speed limit in South Australia is 100 km/h unless otherwise signposted

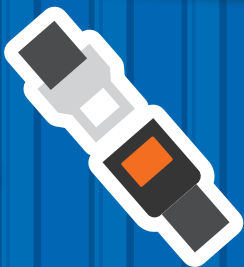

- you must not use a mobile phone whilst driving
  - it is an offence to exceed the prescribed concentration of alcohol for your class of driver's licence (for example 0.05 grams or more of alcohol in 100 millilitres of blood for holders of a full driver's licence)
  - it is an offence to drive a motor vehicle whilst being under the influence of a drug or having a prescribed drug in your blood

When driving long distances across our beautiful state, we recommend you share the driving and stop for at least 15 minutes every 2 hours.
