Re: Freedom of Information Act application

In reference to your application made pursuant to the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act 1991, access was sought to:-

“The number of expiation notices issued by SAPOL issued for exceeding the speed limit; failing to stop at a red light; having an unregistered vehicle; not having current third party insurance; general road traffic offences in the following streets in 2016 and 2017: Broadway and Baker, Victoria and Ramsgate Streets, Glenelg South.”

It is determined to **release in full** the number of expiation notices issued by SAPOL in 2016 and 2017 on Broadway and Baker, Victoria and Ramsgate Streets, Glenelg South. The data has been presented in a table below and was correct as at 9 January 2018.

Your rights to review and appeal

If you are dissatisfied with the determination for access to SAPOL records, you are entitled to exercise your right of internal review in accordance with section 29(1) of the FOI Act by completing a PD362 Application for Internal Review form which can be downloaded from <https://www.police.sa.gov.au/services-and-events/freedom-of-information> or available upon request at your nearest police station. Alternatively an application may be made in writing to the SAPOL Freedom of Information Unit. This application must be lodged within 30 days from the date of this determination with a fee of \$34.25. Such a fee may be waived in the event of an exemption being claimed.
